Law enforcement partners include the Kansas City, Liberty and Gladstone police departments, and the Clay County Sheriff's Department.

File of Life" could save your life

Imagine that you are injured and temporarily unable to communicate effectively with emergency personnel. Without information about your medical situation, how quickly will they be able to provide you with the correct care?

Without knowing what medicines you take, how will paramedics know which drugs they can safely administer to you?

Finally, without contact information, how will the police let your relatives know what has happened?

Clay County Senior Services now has refrigerator magnets and personal wallet size cards for recording vital medical information. Clay County seniors 60 and older can obtain the files of life, freeof-charge, at all fire stations in Clay County and at the Clay County Senior Services offices at 4444 N. Belleview, suite 209. Many local churches and health care professionals are also distributing the files.

The mini-medical history contained in a red plastic sleeve includes emergency contacts, medication information, and advance directive and living will information. This helps paramedics, hospitals, doctors and family more accurately and quickly care provide life-saving care. North KC Schools hails NNI as "Point of Pride"

Strong neighborhoods and strong schools make a strong community. The partnership between North Kansas City Schools and Northland Neighborhoods, Inc. was spotlighted at the June 13 school board meeting when NNI received the district's Point of Pride award.

In presenting the award, district officials highlighted the NNI Board's support of the 2005 school bond and levy issues, a new Police Athletic League (PAL) unit and youth fitness center at Eastgate Middle School, a proposed Neighborhood Youth Advisory Council, the conversion of the former Eastwood School into the Chaumiere Place senior apartments, and collaboration with the district's Interior Design faculty and students on the Irene Jacobs home, a partnership that also included Habitat for Humanity.

"We deeply appreciate the Point of Pride award," said NNI executive director Jim Rice. "It is all the more special that it comes from a school district that I regard as a paragon of excellence," Rice said.
