STATE FARM GRANT GIVES RELIEF TO NNI



ome gentle rain fell on 2009's parched funding landscape when State Farm Insurance Companies presented a \$10,000 grant to NNI on December 17. The grant, to augment NNI's home repair program, is the first State Farm grant made to NNI. "This grant could not have come at a better time," said Jim Rice, NNI CEO. or the past year, KCMO Council members Deb Hermann and Bill Skaggs have conducted the monthly "1st District Roads Update" meetings at NNI. The popular early morning meetings bring together the Council representatives, key City staff and neighborhood residents to talk about roads and other 1st District public improvement concerns. The meetings have improved com-

munications between City staff and residents, brought about some useful adjustments to projects based on ideas from citizens, and engendered a more realistic understanding of how and why projects sometimes do not go as planned.

Building on the generally positive experience with the Roads meetings, Councilwoman Hermann and

Councilman Skaggs are expanding the scope of the meetings to include more complex challenges such as economic development, area planning, and the City budget. The first "Problem-Solving" meeting is January 19, 8:30 a.m. at NNI. The topic will be a vision for the Vivion Road corridor and how that vision can be implemented.
