VIVION ROAD PLAN REACHES ANOTHER MILESTONE

rom Riverside to Claycomo, Vivion Road (also known as Missouri State Highway 69) showcases the Northland Fountain, Anita Gorman Park, the new North Oak Village shopping center, and the regionally popular Penguin Park. Former stars in the Vivion Road galaxy, such as Antioch Mall, have faded but show promise of brightening when long-awaited redevelopment finally gets underway.

The Vivion Road PIEA (Planned Industrial Expansion Authority) Area includes commercial development opportunities on Vivion Road, from Antioch Road to Hardesty. At its March 29 meeting the PIEA Board approved a Blight Study and General Development Plan. The plan will now go to the City Plan Commission and then on to the City Council for final approval. NNI is the plan's sponsor.

Vacant lot inspection training slated for April 20

Common violations include overgrown weeds, abandoned vehicles and dumping. The training session is free and will last no longer than 2 hours.
