### NNI ANNUAL MEETING TARGETED HOME REPAIR PROGRAM

#### TO "ENCORE" SOON

hanks to a community spirited developer, targeted home repair is about to return to neighborhoods in the North Oak corridor area. The program is part of the North Oak TIF plan fueled by new development along North Oak, principally North Oak Village at Vivion and North Oak, HJ LLC (Hunt Midwest and the R.H. Johnson Company), developers of North Oak Village, advanced \$200,000 to jump start the home repair program. The program was to be financed by the sale of \$1 million in bonds, but the economic recession temporarily ruled out a bond sale. When the Story continued on page 2

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#### KCMO TO CONDUCT PET LICENSING

PET LICENSING IS A SERVICE OFFERED AT NNI'S OFFICE. CALL 454–2000 FOR MORE INFORMATION.

he City of Kansas City Animal Health and Public Safety Division will conduct weekly pet licensing enforcement throughout the City from May 5, 2010 through September 1, 2010. This initiative is part of an effort to educate residents on animal health and safety, while improving neighborhood livability.

During the enforcement period, officers will inspect targeted areas for compliance. Citations may be issued to pet owners without a current pet license. City ordinances require residents to license dogs, cats and ferrets. Failure to comply will result in a citation being issued and a minimum \$75 fine. The license fee for a pet is \$10 for a spayed or neutered animal and \$33 for an animal that has not been altered.

Licensing a pet and keeping the license on the pet's collar helps ensure the pet's owner is notified should the pet be impounded by the Animal Health and Public Safety Division. Residents of the

City are provided three methods for licensing a pet:

- Visit Halfway Home Pet Adoptions (the City's animal shelter), at 4400 Raytown Road
- Contact a veterinarian
- Visit Pet Data online by visiting www.petdata.com/cs/ kcm/

When licensing a pet, the owner must provide a copy of the pet's current rabies vaccination certificate and proof of the pet's sterilization (if applicable). To obtain vaccination, contact a local vet or low-cost clinic such as Spay and Neuter Kansas City at 816-353-0940, or Halfway Home Pet Adoptions at 816-921-0201. bond market returns to normalcy, the bonds can be issued, HJ LLC can be repaid its \$200,000, and \$800,000 will be added to the home repair program. In the meantime, the first phase of home repairs will get underway by June.

Homeowners in the North Oak Benefit District who meet income guidelines may be eligible for a home repair grant of up to \$4,500. Grants cover improvements such as roofs, windows, siding, heating and air conditioning, driveways and other non -cosmetic repairs. Boundaries of the benefit district are 47th Street/I-29 on the north, 32nd Street on the south, I-29/I-35/ Woodland on the east, and North Main on the west. The program will be called ENCORE (Enhancing Neighborhoods by Concentrating Organization, Resources & Energy). With ENCORE, NNI hopes to build on the past success of the CHAMP and SMART targeted home repair programs.
