They have a good track record with similar projects and have pledged to work with NNI and neighborhoods adjacent to the mall as they develop a new plan for the venerable shopping center. They have also promised to accelerate the de-

molition of the mall as soon as they can get the necessary permits and approvals from the TIF Commission and City Hall. In meetings with the developers, Council members Deb Hermann and Bill Skaggs have stressed the importance of making the site attractive even during the demolition phase. Say NO to Proposition A

- The initiative would eliminate 42% of Kansas City's general fund over \$200 million annually.
- That cut is larger than the entire budget of the Kansas City Police Department, so it is no wonder the initiative is opposed by police officers, fire fighters, city leaders, and the Greater Kansas City Chamber of Commerce.
- The initiative would likely impose tax increases on lower- and middle-income families by forcing them to pay more in property and sales taxes to make up for the revenue it eliminates.
