#### **NEIGHBORHOOD CLIPS**

November senior workshop to preview classes for older adults Elizabeth Jackson, Adult and Older Adult Program Manager for the Clay County Public Health Center, will be on hand November 10, 9 a.m. to describe three special classes for older adults in Clay County. All of the classes are free and two are workshops. Based on interest, NNI and Clay County Public Health Center staff will schedule the full class. Here they are:

Matter of Balance (MOB) is an 8-class workshop led by volunteer leaders who have been certified to teach. Topics for this class include: home assessments to see what can be done to reduce likelihood of falling at home, exercise, communication, medication management, community resources available to them, and much more. A manual and a copy of the exercises are provided to participants.


PEPPI-Peer Exercise Promotes
Independence class, led by trained volunteers, consists of exercises (most done in a chair) and focuses on increasing strength, endurance, flexibility and balance. Participants get a resistance band matched to their current level of strength as well

#### **Chronic Disease Self**
