attraction for NNI's Jawill again The will again The Second Secon A 5-K run/walk is the latest attraction for NNI's July 30, 2011 Night Out Against Crime Kick-Off. The Kick-Off will again be held in Gladstone's Oak Grove Park, from 5 to 8:30 p.m.

The run will begin at 7 p.m. in Oak Grove Park and conclude there about an hour later. In tribute to the potentially steamy July weather, the run will be called the Northland Hot Trot. Pre-registration fee is \$20 until May 1, \$25 from May 2 to July 11, \$30 July 12 until the day of the event. The Family-Friendly Fun Run is \$5 per family.
