"As CEO for the last eight years, Jim Rice brought NNI into the mainstream of community development corporations, launched new housing initiatives, and established the organization as a key player in the Northland.

Deb Hermann is the perfect person to lead NNI in this new era of scarce resources, volatility in the housing market, and an evolving Northland," Fowler says. He cited Hermann's reputation as a neighborhood leader and member of the City Plan Commission, and her City Council experience as Chair of the Housing and Finance and Audit Committee. Fowler said Hermann's success in balancing three of the most difficult budgets



in Kansas City history was evidence of her financial skill, her knowledge of the City, and her ability to bring all segments of the community together around important goals.

Rice is also excited about
Hermann's new role. "I was an
enthusiastic supporter of the
reorganization from the git-go,"
Rice says. "We've accomplished
many good things during the last
eight years. But now we need new
ideas and new energy at the top.
We are extremely fortunate to
have landed Deb before someone
else did. I feel very honored and
privileged to be a part of the
Hermann team."
