**A**s of May 22, 79 neighborhoods had been certified to cast a vote for Board members at the June 26 Annual Meeting of Northland Neighborhoods, Inc. (See related story on page 2) NNI presents the following slate of Board candidates:

Misty Dawn Casey was appointed March 15, 2004 to the NNI Board. She lives in the Pine Lake neighborhood and currently serves on NNI's Planning and Development Committee. Misty is running for her first full term, which would expire in June 2009.

Dan Fowler was appointed to the NNI Board on February 20. A resident of Coves North, he currently serves on the Planning and Development Committee. He is running for his first full term, which would expire in June 2009.

John McNerney was appointed to the Board on April 18, 2005. John is active in the Claymont neighborhood and currently serves on the Administration & Finance and Resource Development Committees. John is running for his first full term, which would expire in June 2009.

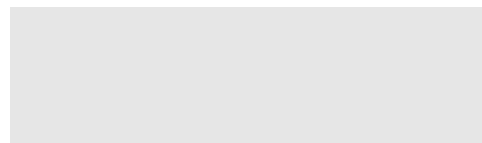

### *Connections*: Speakers, topics lined up for June, July, August and September

**Jean Ann Lawson**, Operations Manager, Office of the City Manager, will be on hand June 13 to explain the new "311" system to be launched in late 2006. This system will provide a single point of access for information on city services and programs.

**Judy Hadley** with the City's Regulated Industries Division (formerly Liquor Control) will be at NNI on July 11. Judy will discuss how her division tries to balance business and neighborhood concerns related to liquor licenses.

**Michael Schumacher**, head of Kansas City's Animal Health and Safety Division (formerly Animal Control), is the *Connections* guest for August 8. This is a chance to hear about the City's plans for improved protection for urban pets.



**Dennis Murphey** from the City's Environmental Management Office will speak at the September 12 *Connections* meeting. Dennis will address issues ranging from trash collection to preservation of natural resources.

*Connections* meetings are held on the second Tuesday of each month, at 6:30 p.m. at NNI. The meetings update neighborhood leaders on important issues and programs affecting neighborhoods, the city and the region.

### Red Cross offers smoke detectors geared for the hearing impaired

The American Red Cross now offers two varieties of smoke alarms for the hearing impaired. One alarm uses a strobe light as the alerting device and another sends a signal from the transmitter to the receiver that causes a vibration to notify a sleeping person. NNI's second annual National Night Out Against Crime Kick-Off promises to be even bigger and better than last year's very successful event. ### June 14 Senior Seminar will deal with depression in older adults

Depression impacts the quality of life of millions of Americans, especially older adults already coping with other life stresses. The Health Care Foundation of Kansas City has awarded a grant to Tri-County Mental Health Services to assist older adults suffering from depression. NNI's June 14 senior workshop will focus on this important new program. The grant provides for community education sessions (the June 14 senior workshop is the first), training to help volunteers identify the symptoms of depression and make referrals for further assessment. The grant will also train 50 mental health professionals in the clinical treatment and care of depression in older adults.
