n October 8, Northland Neighborhoods will end a 10year stint at the venerable Antioch Mall and move to a newer office building at 3015 NE Vivion Road (adjacent to Tires Plus). The new facility is accessible from both Vivion Road and Chouteau Trafficway, has more efficient offices,

PIAC sales tax renewal crucial to neighborhoods

or nearly 25 years, Kansas City has funded such basic infrastructure needs as street repair and flood control through a 1-cent sales tax that pays for projects in neighborhoods throughout the city. Last renewed in 1999, the tax is due to be renewed with a special election on November 6, 2007. If approved by voters, the proposal would continue the 1-cent Sales Tax for Capital Improvements for 10 vears. The ballot issue does not raise taxes; it extends a tax that has been in place for nearly 25 years. At least 35 percent of tax receipts must

be used for neighborhood conservation, maintenance, and improvements, divided equally among the six Council districts.

The 1-cent sales tax now generates \$60 million to \$70 million a year. All tax receipts must be spent as recommended by the Public Improvements Advisory Committee (PIAC) and approved by the City Council.
