The Metro North Community Recycling Center needs extra volunteers to help provide recycling services to Northland residents. The center accepts approximately 20 items for recycling, including many not accepted through Kansas City's curbside recycling program. Volunteers assist recyclers with their materials and provide important one-on-one education. Scheduling for individuals or groups is flexible. Bid farewell to the yucky stuff with A.B.O.P.T.

A.B.O.P.T. (antifreeze, batteries, oil, paint, and tires) arrives June 7. Once again, thanks to cooperation from area municipalities, Northland Neighborhoods will sponsor a household hazardous waste collection site from 8 a.m. to noon Saturday, June 7 in the east parking lot of Antioch Shopping Center. ABOPT is a first come-first serve opportunity to dispose of environmentally sensitive materials in a safe, responsible way.

The service is free to residents of participating municipalities. In addition to the items mentioned above, there will be a dumpster for recycling metal items. Proceeds from the sale of the metal items will benefit NNI. There is a 300-car limit, so arrive early! Also new this year, a paper shredder for document shredding and recycling.

The following items will be accepted: antifreeze, car and household batteries, oil (auto-

motive oil, cooking, heating, etc.), paints and paint-related chemicals such as strippers, thinners, varnishes, and spray paints. There will be a tire drop off (with or without rims) open to all residents. There will be leaf and brush dumpsters available for

KANSAS CITY RESI-DENTS ONLY. Leaves must be in paper bags, not plastic.

There will also be a metal recycling bin available for steel,

iron and aluminum items, old metal bikes and toys, structural beams, electric motors, radiators, stainless steel and rebar. The following communities are eligible: Belton, Blue Springs, Claycomo, Cleveland, Excelsior Springs, Garden City, Gladstone, Grain Valley, Greenwood, Harrisonville, Independence, Kansas City, MO., Kearney, Lake Tapawingo, Lake Waukomis, Lake Winnebago, Lee's Summit, Liberty, North Kansas City, Oak Grove, Parkville, Peculiar, Platte City, Pleasant Hill, Pleasant Valley, Raymore, Riverside, Smithville, Sugar Creek, Weatherby Lake, Unincorporated Cass County, Unincorporated Clay County, Unincorporated Jackson County, Unincorporated Platte County. (Clay County includes residents of Mosby, Missouri City, Prathersville, Randolph, Birmingham, Holt, Oakview, Oakwood, Oakwood Park, and Oaks. Jackson County includes residents of Levasy, Unity Village, Sibley, and River Bend. Platte County includes residents of Tracy, Platte Woods, Farley, Northmoor, Houston Lake, Iatan, and Ridgely.)


