A.B.O.P.T. encores Saturday, May 2 at Antioch Shopping Center



NNI, the City of Kansas City and Antioch Center will again sponsor safe disposal of household waste from 8 a.m. to noon Saturday May 2 in the east parking lot (Chouteau Trafficway side) of Antioch Shopping Center. ABOPT (antifreeze, batteries, oil, paint and tires) is a first come-first served opportunity to dispose of environmentally sensitive materials in a safe, responsible way. Leaf and brush dumpsters will be available for Kansas City Residents ONLY. Leaves must be in paper—not plastic—bags. There will also be a metal recycling bin available for steel and iron items, aluminum items, old metal bikes and toys, structural beams, electric motors, radiators, stainless steel and rebar. Check the NNI website (nni.org) for details on which Missouri communities are eligible for ABOPT.
