

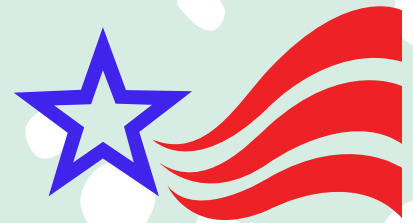

Construction is 70% complete on Lorie's House, a new universal design home at 4413 N. Kensington in the Winnwood-Sunnybrook neighborhood. The new homeowner is Lorie Perdieu, a local advocate for the disabled who has herself been disabled since birth. Despite the many obstacles she has faced since infancy, Lorie has become an articulate and tireless worker for the disabled. Lorie's

House is an opportunity to let the world know how productive and independent disabled persons can be...with a little help.

The project is a collaboration of Northland Neighborhoods, Inc. (NNI), the Christian Carpenters, and the Fuller Center for Housing. Financing is supported by a \$60,000 HUD grant to NNI, cash and in-kind contributions from the Christian

KCMO TO CONDUCT PET LICENSING

PET LICENSING IS A SERVICE OFFERED AT NNI'S OFFICE, CALL 454-2000 FOR MORE INFORMATION.

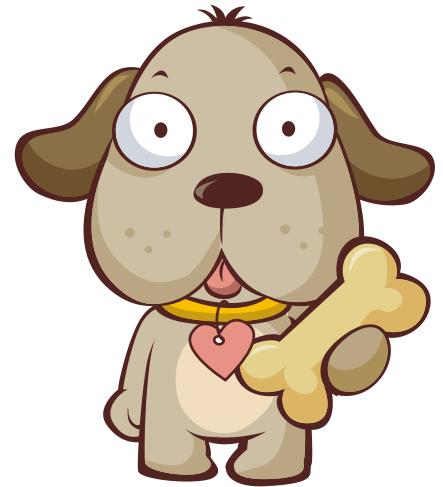
The City of Kansas City Animal Health and Public Safety Division will conduct weekly pet licensing enforcement throughout the City from May 5, 2010 through September 1, 2010. This initiative is part of an effort to educate residents on animal health and safety, while improving neighborhood livability.

During the enforcement period, officers will inspect targeted areas for compliance. Citations may be issued to pet owners without a current pet license. City ordinances require residents to license dogs, cats and ferrets. Failure to comply will result in a citation being issued and a minimum \$75 fine. The license fee for a pet is \$10 for a spayed or neutered animal and \$33 for an animal that has not been altered.

Licensing a pet and keeping the license on the pet's collar helps ensure the pet's owner is notified should the pet be impounded by the Animal Health and Public Safety Division. Residents of the City are provided three methods for licensing a pet:

- Visit Halfway Home Pet Adoptions (the City's animal shelter), at 4400 Raytown Road
- Contact a veterinarian
- Visit Pet Data online by visiting www.petdata.com/cs/kcm/

When licensing a pet, the owner must provide a copy of the pet's current rabies vaccination certificate and proof of the pet's sterilization (if applicable). To obtain vaccination, contact a local vet or low-cost clinic such as Spay and Neuter Kansas City at 816-353-0940, or Halfway Home

NNI OFFERS VARIETY OF HOME REPAIR PROGRAMS

Several home repair programs are available for low-income Northland families. One could fit your needs, so check them out.

ENCORE

Targeted home repair returned to North Oak corridor neighborhoods in June, thanks to the North Oak TIF plan. You may be eligible for a home repair grant of up to \$4,500 for improvements such as roofs, windows, siding, heating and air conditioning, driveways and other non-cosmetic repairs. Homeowners above income limits can also obtain a grant, but must match it dollar for dollar. Boundaries of the benefit district are 47th Street/I-29 on the north, 32nd Street on the south, I-29/I-35/Woodland on the east, and North Main on the west.

CUSTOM SOLUTIONS

Funded by the Community Development Block Grant, Clay County, and private grants, this program provides generally identical benefits as ENCORE, but residents need not live in the ENCORE benefit area.

CLAY COUNTY SENIOR SERVICES

This program is designed for seniors who need repairs costing \$1,000 or less. Included are plumbing and electrical repairs, barrier removal and a number of other items.

NNI, Police Academy to sponsor driving safety course for seniors

On July 29, from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. (includes 1-hour break for lunch), AARP driving instructors will conduct a driver refresher course geared especially for seniors. The program will be held in Room 304 of the new Regional Police Academy, 6885 NE Pleasant Valley Road. Here are five good reasons to take the course:

- Learn defensive driving techniques, new traffic laws, rules of the road, and much more.
- Find out how to adjust your driving to age-related changes in vision, hearing, and reaction time.
- Auto insurance companies in most states provide a discount to AARP graduates.
- You don't have to take a test.

The course is normally \$14 for non-AARP members and \$12 for members. However, NNI will cover the cost of the instruction and the box lunch. All you need to do register with NNI at 454-2000. NNI weighs in on waste

More than 550 households took advantage of ABOPT, NNI's annual hazardous household waste drop-off and pick up on Saturday, June 5, at the Antioch Shopping Center. ABOPT stands for Antifreeze,

Batteries, Oil, Paint and Tires.

Results:

- 32,525 pounds of antifreeze, oil, paint and batteries
- 637 tires
- Nearly 5 tons of leaves and brush
- 9,750 pounds of paper shredding
- 6,363 pounds of electronics
- 160 pounds of outdated pharmaceuticals

MCSP workers worked 69 hours at the event and NNI volunteers clocked 96 hours.

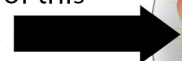
