Get out and VOTE on April 8



From all of us at Northland Neighborhoods, we encourage everyone to vote in the next special election on Tuesday, April 8. As a civil right, we strongly believe it is a citizen's privilege and responsibility to vote on issues that will impact their communities.

At this next election, there are varying questions per each municipality, however, there are two issues that will affect all northland neighborhoods. The North Kansas City School District is asking voters to approve a \$20 million bond and a 26-cent operating levy. This will:

- Create classroom space to manage crowding
- Ensure safer places to learn and work
- Include overdue repairs/maintenance at schools/facilities
- Continue current educational programs
- Manage new student growth

The district is growing by 250-300 students a year and has suffered from declining local tax revenues. It's been seven years since the last tax election, and the NKCS D is asking voters for your support.
