MODOT PROJECT UPDATES

MoDot has moved the North Brighton bridge work up one week. Crews will close north bound and southbound lanes of North Brighton Avenue over I-35 beginning Monday, April 4 through Saturday, May 28th.

JUMP INTO SPRING CLEANING!

It's time to clean all the leaves and brush out of your yards as Spring has arrived. KC Water Services, on behalf of the City of Kansas City, Missouri, conducts scheduled curbside leaf and brush collections each spring and fall.

For Spring 2016:

Residents who live in Kansas City **NORTH** (from the Missouri River, north to the city limit) will receive curbside leaf and brush collection from **April 25th – April 29th**. Curbside collection will take place on your regularly-scheduled trash day.

Curbside Leaf and Brush Collection Rules:

- Place at curb by 7AM of your regular pick-up day
- No more than 20 sacks or bundles per household
- Must not weigh more than 40 pounds each
- No plastic bags, paper sacks only
- Do not seal bags with plastic or duct tape
- No grass clippings or trash
- Must group all branches in bundles
- Branches must be less than 3 inches diameter
- Bundles must not exceed 2 ft diameter or 4 ft long
- Use twine or jute rope to tie bundles, no wire

NEIGHBORHOOD PRESERVATION COMMITTEE
