"I know my way around here. I am very familiar with the area I patrol," said Corum, a 17-year veteran most

Corum's inspiration to serve our community is his wife of 14 years and their two children. All of whom enjoy playing soccer, watching KC Chiefs, and fishing at the lake. His humble hopes is to make the Northland neighborhoods one percent better than before he inherited his new role.

The closed and abandoned Kmart on Vivion Road has long been a blighting influence in the area and a cause for much consternation from neighbors.

As we have related to the many of you who have contacted the NNI office about this property over many years; we were working on it. We know this had to sound like hot air and you may have given up at times. (We almost did!)

However, many years of effort have paid off and change is coming! On May 20th, the Ride KC Development Corporation led efforts to purchase the property for KCATA. Redevelopment planning will begin in the near future for a new Transit Oriented Development (TOD). TOD's develop vibrant, livable, sustainable communities. It is the creation of a compact, walkable, pedestrian-oriented, mixed -use community.

No details are available yet because the surrounding businesses and

neighborhood leaders will participate in building the detailed plans. YOU will be the planners!


